Role Title	Arts Volunteer – Space Academy
Purpose of Role	To support an ECHC Arts Officer to deliver the Space Academy programme to children and young people in the RHCYP. Space Academy is a 21-day programme of activities for completion by children and young people who are clinically isolated. The programme has been developed based on the daily routine and experiences of an astronaut, likening it to that of a child's daily hospital routine.
